



Beavers

Parents are asked to provide a turquoise uniform sweatshirt, which their child may wear as soon as they have it. These may be purchased from <http://shop.scouts.org.uk/> or from Firths uniform shop on Low Street in Keighley.

For normal Colony meetings Beavers may wear clean and presentable shoes (including trainers). For official occasions they must wear dark socks and well-polished black shoes.

The Group supplies a woggle, denoting the lodge colour, and a neckerchief, which should not be worn until a Beaver has been invested.

From time to time we will undertake "dirty" or outdoor pursuits and on these occasions the Beavers may be asked to wear Rough Kit as an alternative to their uniform. This may be any form of old clothing, including footwear appropriate to the occasion. Beavers will be informed in advance of occasions when it will be necessary to wear rough kit.

All Beavers' belongings must be clearly marked with their name so that they may be returned should they go astray.



Cub Scouts

Parents are asked to provide a green uniform sweatshirt, which their child may wear as soon as they have it. These may be purchased from <http://shop.scouts.org.uk/> or from Firths uniform shop on Low Street in Keighley.

For normal Pack meetings Cubs may wear clean and presentable dark coloured sports trousers (including jeans) and any presentable shoes (including trainers). For official occasions Cubs must wear neatly pressed dark grey or black long school trousers, dark socks and well-polished black shoes.

The Group supplies a woggle, denoting the six colour, and a neckerchief, which should not be worn until Cubs have been invested, unless previously a Beaver Scout.

From time to time we will undertake "dirty" or outdoor pursuits and on these occasions the Cubs may be asked to wear Rough Kit as an alternative to their uniform. This may be any form of old clothing, including footwear appropriate to the occasion. The Cubs will be informed in advance of occasions when it will be necessary to wear rough kit.

All Cubs' belongings must be clearly marked with their name so that they may be returned should they go astray.



Scouts

For normal Troop meetings Scouts may wear clean and presentable trousers and any presentable shoes (including trainers). For official occasions Scouts must wear neatly pressed dark grey or black long school trousers, dark socks and well-polished black shoes or official Scout trousers.

The Group supplies a woggle and a neckerchief, which they should not wear until he is invested, unless previously invested as a Cub Scout.

From time to time we will undertake "dirty" or outdoor pursuits and on these occasions the boys may be asked to wear Rough Kit as an alternative to their uniform. This may be any form of old clothing, including footwear appropriate to the occasion. The scouts will be informed in advance of occasions when it will be necessary to wear rough kit.

All Scouts' belongings must be clearly marked with their name so that they may be returned should they go astray.
